## Animals

(3+): Our No-Words Animal Bingo helps the little ones learn animals, and even allows some of the younger players to play as host.

## Sight Words

(5+): Now they know their ABCs, how about graduating to Sight Words?

(4+): An awesome way to learn the alphabet via fun icons to help them associate the letters to objects. Don't tell them this is learning ;).

## Traditional

(5-99+): A fun-for-the-whole-family version of classic Bingo. Also a great way to teach numbers.

## Set Up

Select which version you're ready to play and grab the associated cards and token bag. Choose someone to be the host (probably a parent) and hand each player a Bingo Card.

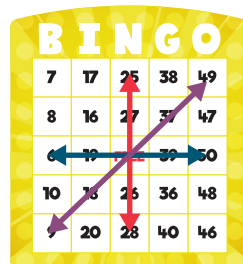
Place a marker on the **FREE** space if the card has one.



# Goal/How to Win

The first player to get a full *horizontal*, *vertical*, or *diagonal* row (4-in-a-row for Animal and Alphabet or 5-in-a-row for Sight Words and Traditional) and say “**Bingo!**” wins.

## ANOTHER WAY TO PLAY: FULL CARD BINGO

In *Full Card Bingo Mode*, the first player who fills all of their spaces on their card and yells out “Bingo!” is the winner.

# How to Play

Even though there’s 4 ways to play, the rules are the same for every mode. See back for additional notes for little learners.

1. The host reaches into the bag, grabs **one** token, reads it aloud (*be sure to read both sides where applicable*), and shows it to all players. They then place the token in a row, in the center of the play area to help keep track of which words have been called.
2. Each player checks to see if their cards have the animal, word, letter, or number that was just called out - if so, they place a marker on that space.
3. Repeat steps **1 & 2** until someone completes a row & yells “**Bingo!**”. Check that player’s card against the tokens in the center to see if they indeed won. If they did, declare them the winner. If they were incorrect, keep playing until you have a true winner.

# For Our Little Learners

We encourage you to use Family Bingo as a learning tool for your little one(s). Here are just a few tips to get you started:

- Solo Matching Mode: A fun way for them to practice foundational skills is to choose a card from any of the four themes, pull a token and see if there's a match. If so, place the token on the card. The goal is to fill up the card.
- At the start of a game, give them a minute to look and study their cards. Feel free to see if they can identify and/or read each item on their card before playing.
- For Sight Words Bingo, it may help to pull a word token, read it, use it in a sentence, then read it one more time.
- To promote more learning, switch cards at the end of each round before the next game.
